FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK



It is lovely to have our students involved in events in and around the college again at the start of the term. Over the first three weeks it was lovely to see our students get involved in ANZAC Day, attend excursions and several BSE sporting teams compete in Sandhurst competitions. Many of our students are getting involved in the extra-curricular activities on offer this term. These are fantastic ways for students to learn new skills, make new friends, develop teamwork and be committed to the roles they play in these environments outside of the classroom. I do encourage our students to keep an eye out for what is on offer each term and consider signing up for an activity.

A positive attitude extends beyond being happy go lucky towards others but includes having a positive mindset or a growth mindset about oneself. Thankfully, the mind can be trained. It starts by reframing challenges as opportunities for growth and learning and embracing setbacks as lessons to improve. This can be in any area of learning e.g., learning a new concept, playing an instrument, developing sporting skills.

Three simple ways to improve a person's attitude;

- Feed yourself the right “food”. If you’ve been starved of anything positive, then you need to start feeding yourself a regular diet of motivational material. Read articles/books, listen to podcasts that encourage a positive attitude. The more negative you are, the longer it will take to turn your attitude around. But if you consume a steady diet of the right ‘food’, you can become a positive thinker.
- Achieve a goal every day. Set achievable daily goals for yourself. A pattern of positive achievement will help you develop a pattern of positive thinking.
- Write it on your mirror. We all need reminders to help us keep thinking right. As incentive, people put up awards they’ve won, inspirational posters, or letters they’ve received. Find something that will work for you and put it on your wall.

In summary, with a positive attitude, created through gratefulness, combined with the constructive habits listed above, a growth mindset can be created.

Safe, equal and respected.

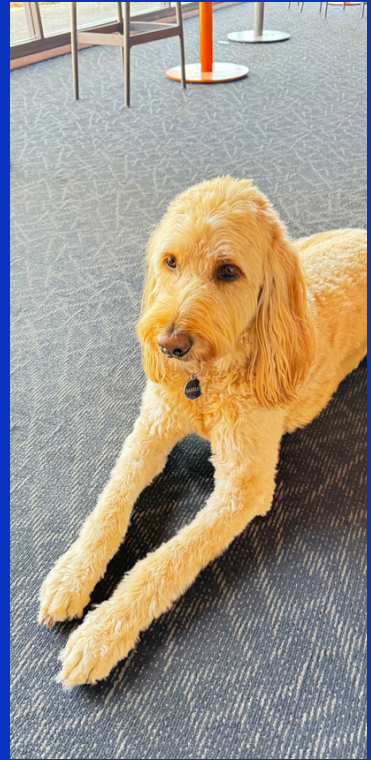

This approach leads to positive impacts on students’ academic outcomes, mental health, classroom behaviour, and relationships with our BSE community members.

Respectful relationships goes beyond curriculum, recognising that to drive real change, classroom learning needs to be reinforced by what is modelled within our community. As influencers of young people, we want the best for our students. We want them to have positive experiences, healthy relationships and opportunities to learn. We want them to understand right and wrong. We want them to respect others and respect themselves. It’s important we understand the cycle of violence. Not all disrespect towards women results in violence. But all violence against women starts with disrespectful behaviour.

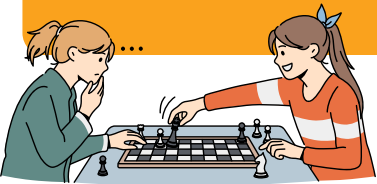

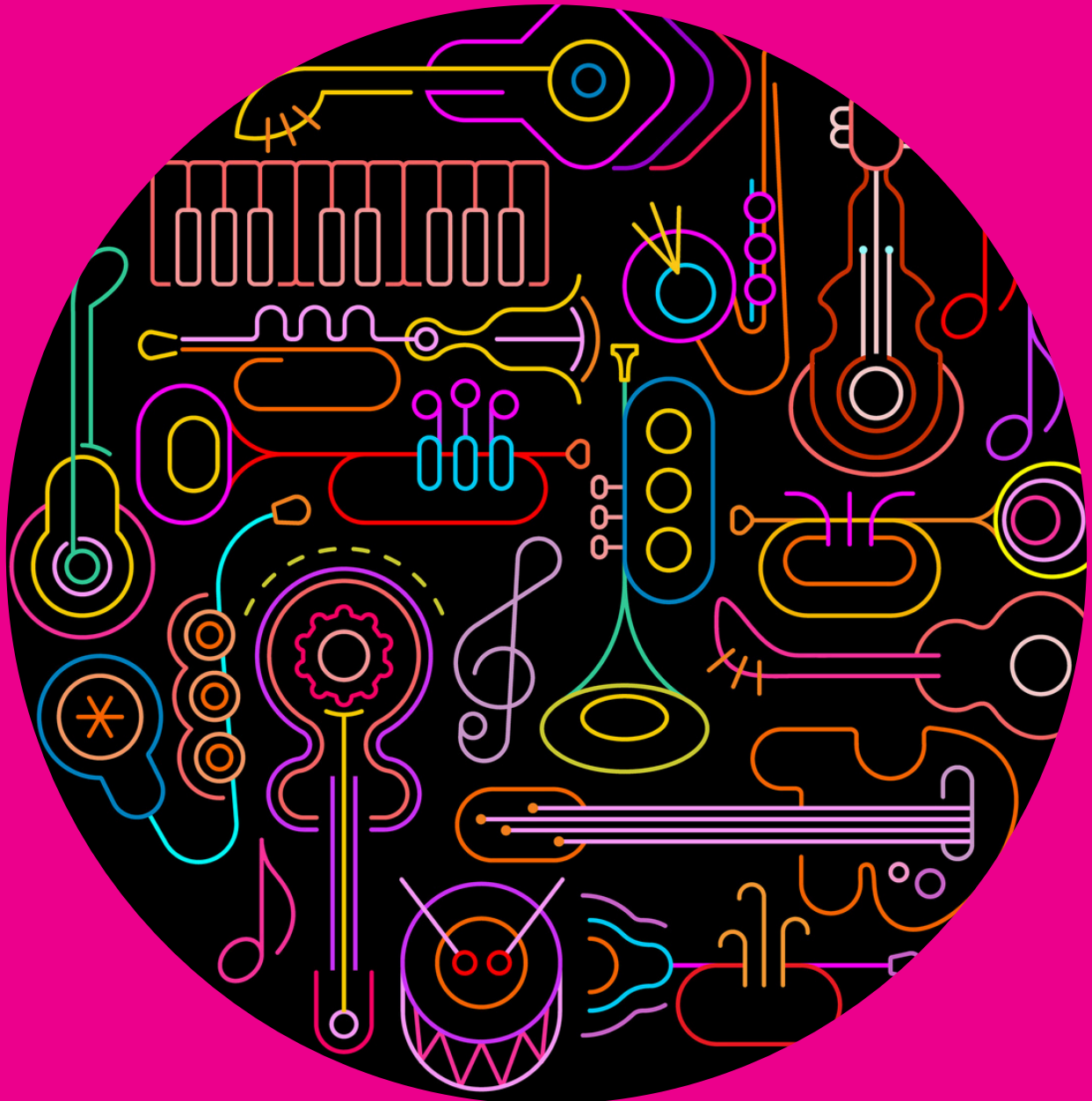
